You should read good periodicals, such as The New York Tile. The christian Science Monitor, The Atlantic, The New Yorker, Tire In Emomist, and Scientific American. In addition to reading these types (periodicals, you should read books that develop more extended regularity, such as Consilience, the Unity of Knowledge by the er ne a scientist Edward O. Wilson and Beyond Freedom and Dignity the influential modern thinker B. F. Skinner. Reading such a rial increase your knowledge in important areas. It will also in. nour ability to understand complex sentence structure and follow a phisticated line of reasoning. If, as you read, you look up unfal iliar words in a good dictionary, your vocabulary will also improve.

Speaking of vocabulary is a portant to have a good knowledge of advanced words to do we in the GRE? The answer is "Yes, definitely." The test place considerable emphasis on advanced vocabulary, especially in the antonin in malogy, and sentence completion questions.
