Preface

This book is the result of the experience of thirty-three years of teaching Grammar and Writing to the university students. It is written for the students of English at an "intermediate" or "advanced" level, based on the assumption that they are neither beginner nor expert in English.

The leading target of the book is to help the students who have already enough knowledge of the fundamental concepts of English Grammar such as the parts of speech, auxiliaries, etc... to write different kinds of correct sentences. Beginning with the definition of "sentence" and continuing with the different types of sentence patterns, the students gradually master in writing Simple, Compound, Complex, and Compound Complex sentences. The last chapters focus on writing the technical sentences in Reported speech, Conditional, and Passive forms.

Meanwhile, each chapter consists of examples accompanied by many exercises. Finally, while chapters in this book are self-contained units, it is recommended that the teacher present them in the given order.

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
