## Foreword

General English in Use is a course-book intended to provide undergraduate students with sufficient practice of the basic English they need for their later academic studies. The textbook will lead the learners at the elementary level to the intermediate level of proficiency in English. As there is a widespread agreement among educators that a university student needs to improve his/her vocabulary and reading ability, the book meets this need by covering various strategies and techniques for better reading and comprehension. The complex structure of texts at ESP (English or Specific Purposes) to which the students will be exposed later in their reading urged us to provide a variety of activities as well as authentic and up-to-date passages.

Each lesson in this book starts with a passage. The passages have been selected from modern English writings on a variety of useful topics to motivate the students of different fields of study and help than to gas appreading English texts and basic vocabulary as well as the writing skill and order to enrich their knowledge of vocabulary the book focuses on an world ormation process rather than memorizing a long list of words in is that in pendix one prepares some common roots, suffixes and prefixes for that it is identified as supposed to read the texts and check the vocabulary is ms using dictionary before attending the class; focus should be on using the passage.

Study skills such as skimming, so nning, getting the meaning from the context, use of prefixes and suffixes in a meaningful context and analyzing the text structure add to the wealth of lassroom activities.

The basic assumpt on wind composing the exercises has been that the subconscious proces. It arning a language is active when the learner's mind is consciously occupied with challenging tasks which call for the use of language. So the exercises are esigned to make the students frequently refer to the passage and to a not the context.

A complementary grammar section succeeds the reading and vocabulary to help students comprehend the structure of phrases, clauses and the units of meaning as well as compound and complex sentences. This will make them elicit the meaning from longer and occasionally confusing structures that they may face in studying ESP. Each unit closes with some ideas for a classroom discussion which can also be used as an idea for writing a simple paragraph as an extra activity. Such writings may develop into an essay. Eight pictorial stories are included in Appendix Two. They consist of three parts, namely key words, sentence patterns and questions in order to initiate discussion and guide the students to write a relevant story.
