## Preface

English has acquired a unique status among the other languages of the world in that it has been acknowledged as a 'global language'. The ESP focal point is that English is not taught as a subject separated from the students' real world (or wishes); instead, it is integrated into a subject matter area important to the learners.

One of the most important factors in an efficient education process is students' motivation; their wants and weaknesses in studying

a particular subject are crucial and should be taken into consideration in the process of syllabus design. Overall, the needs of the students should be of vital importance in designing ESP books. Needs analysis (also known as needs assessment) has a vital role in the process of designing and carrying out any language course, whether it is English for Specific Purposes (ESP) courses. It generally refers to the activities that are involved in collecting information that will serve as the basis for developing a curriculum that will meet the needs of a particular group of students.
