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Preface

Phrasal verbs play a significant role in the English language. Since these two-word verbs are extremely common and widely used in spoken English, EFL learners need to have a good knowledge of them in order to succeed in international exams such as the TOEFL and IELTS. Moreover, using these verbs appropriately gives the candidates for such exams the chance to sound like native speakers of English. On occasion, EFL learners complain about the difficulty of learning phrasal verbs. What they sometimes do is that they prepare a list of two-word verbs and then try to memorize them, but since the verbs are learned out of context, they do not go to their long term memory and are easily forgotten. As a result, the job of learning these verbs is effortful and time-consuming for language learners. In this book, samples are provided to help learners comprehend the meanings of phrasal verbs within context.
