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### Foreword

General English Reader for University Students is a course-book intended to provide undergraduate students with sufficient practice of the basic English they need for their later academic studies. The textbook will lead the learners at the eminent level to the intermediate level of proficiency in English. As there is a widespread agreement a nong educators that a university student needs to improve his/her vocabulary and reading ability, the book meets this hier by covering various strategies and techniques for hiter reading and comprehension. The complex structure of texts at ESP (English for Specific Purposes) to which the true into will be exposed later in their reading caused us to provide a variety of activities as well as authentic and up to-cate passages for them.

Each lesson in this book starts with a warm-up activity. Students are to consider the question(s) carefully in advance and be ready to express their opinions. This will also check the readers' initial up act tanding and form a basis for classroom discussions to develop their comprehension.

Then comes the passage. The passages have been selected from modern English writings on a variety of useful topics to not rate the students of different fields of study and help them to grasp reading English texts and basic vocabulary as well as the writing skill. Students are supposed to read the texts and check the vocabulary items by a dictionary before attending the class; focus should be on using the phonetic alphabet.

Study skills such as skimming, scanning, getting the meaning from the context, use of prefixes and suffixes in a

meaningful context and analyzing the text structure add to the wealth of classroom activities.

The basic assumption behind composing the exercises has been that the subconscious process of learning a language is active when the learner's mind is consciously occupied with challenging tasks which call for the use of language. So the exercises are designed to make the students frequently refer to the passage and focus on the context.

A complementary grammar section succeeds the reading and vocabulary to help students comprehend the cructure of phrases, clauses, the units of meaning as well as compound and complex sentences. This will make them to elicit the meaning from longer and occa ionally confusing structures. The unit closes with some aux as for a classroom discussion which can also be used as confuse for writing a simple paragraph as an outside activity, such writings may develop to an essay.
