Whereas learners are able to acquire linguistic on s without any instructional intervention, they typically do not achieve very high levels of linguistic competence from entirely meaning-centered instruction. For example, students in immersion programs in Canada failed to acquire such features as

verb tense markings even after many years of study. CLT was also criticized for neglecting the form of language and too much focus on meaning. This had led second language acquisition researchers such as Swain (1995) to propose that learners need to do more than to simply engage in communicative language use; they also need to attend to form.

The grammar exercises in high school textbooks are mechanical. They include isolated softeness, substitution drills, and completion drills (Azizifer et al. 2000) in countries like Iran where the school course books have not been changed and accordingly teaching methods are the ame (traditional focus on forms), it seems that meaningful ess or activity is of little importance. Focus on forms in ay in a students in short term but in long term the problem areas, especially when they go to upper levels. So, a way should be found for learners to learn grammar through ways other than

memorization and focus on form instruction can be considered as a better candidate for classroom instruction.
